Prior to working with Google, Sinéad worked as an e-learning specialist with Kilroy's College and Trinity College, Dublin. She began her career in Carr Communications and also spent a short time working in GOAL. Sinéad has also served for the last two years as a non-executive board member of One Family, an organisation which helps one family parent families and families in transition.

Sinéad holds a BA in History from the University of Ulster, an MSc in IT and Education from Trinity College, a postgraduate cert from IADT in Cyberpsychology and most recently an MSc in Equality Studies from UCD.
